

## Cloverdale Rodeo & Exhibition Association to hold AGM Oct. 17

The Cloverdale Rodeo & Exhibition Association is holding its Annual General Meeting Oct. 17.

Members will be voting on some key positions, including president.

Current president Shannon Claypool said the meeting will be held in the Agriplex.

'We're looking forward to a positive meeting for the fiscal year 2020," he said. "Despite not having an event in 2020, it was a positive year financially because of our relationships with the movie industry.

(Several Hollywood productions have rented the Fairgrounds over the past two years, including Sonic the Hedgehog 2 and the ongoing Warner Bros. production Superman and Lois.)

"We're also looking forward to our new agreement and relationship with the City of Surrey as we move
